

The scene is set on arrival as we dine in Kingston's elegantly restored No. 9 Quality Row building, while we help solve the mystery of "Who Killed the Surveyor?" We are the audience and the actors on this tour, as the events unfold and the story is woven through a delicious three course meal. Norfolk Island Orientation Tour

This morning we get to discover the wonderful Island. Our guide will explain all of the Island's history from Polynesian settlements many years ago to how life is today on Norfolk Island. We cover most of the Island and learn what it was like in the first settlement, during penal times in Norfolk Island and the arrival of the Pitcairn Islanders, descendants of the famous Mutiny on the Bounty. Visit Kingston, Cascade, Anson Bay and the wonderful St Barnabas Chapel.

Fletcher's Mutiny Cyclorama

This afternoon we visit the Cyclorama, a multi award winning Norfolk Island attraction. Cyclorama is an amazing 360 degree mural that vividly illustrates the journey of the Bounty aboard the HMS Bounty from England to Tahiti to Pitcairn Island and Norfolk Island. An experience not to be missed!

Bounty Folk Museum

The Bounty Folk Museum is a treasure chest of history, an Aladdin's cave full of fantastic collections, excellent learning resources and inspiring information stretching back to 1788. Featuring a broad cross-section of photographs, text and memorabilia from 1788 onwards.

Bounty Bar & Grill - 1856 The Untold Story

This evening we enjoy dinner at the Bounty Bar and Grill, then witness 1856 The Untold Story. On 8 June 1856 a total of 194 people, descendants from the Bounty, arrived on Norfolk Island from Pitcairn Island aboard the Morayshire. The descendants arrived in cold, wet blustery conditions. Few had ever been to sea before, they were seasick, homesick, and heartsick. The journey of 6,000 km (3,700 miles) took five weeks before arriving to a recently abandoned penal settlement, set aside for the 'worst of the worst'. It was full of ghosts and memories. 1856 - The Untold Story follows their journey in the World Heritage Listed Kingston area, recounting stories of the families, where they lived and how they adapted to their new life on Norfolk Island on this evocative tour.

Following the closure of the penal settlement, Norfolk became home to the Bounty Mutineer Descendants. Our enjoyable journey with these amazing storytellers includes a light lunch and bar facilities on-site.

Commandant's Dinner

This factual yet fun dinner theatre is a great way to learn about Norfolk's history. The cast of actors take us on an entertaining journey back in time. Be enthralled by the Commandants' stories about the notorious convict settlements and how the convicts were treated by sadists and reformers, listen to a chilling recall of one of the infamous rebellions. Marvel at how the Commandants and their families adapted to life in a Norfolk Island penal colony, recreating a little piece of England in the Pacific. Explore their great challenges, impressive successes and shameful secrets. Our venue has created a special three course dinner menu of traditional English fare to compliment the theatrical setting. Hearty, wholesome, British tucker fit for a Commandant and his good lady wife – fortunately prepared by free men in a modern kitchen not a poor convict over a wood stove! The Commandants' Dinner and Show is a night of great entertainment, delectable food and loads of humour – not for the faint hearted! Bar facilities available.

Captain Cook Landing Re-enactment
